This museum was the Wayne County Jail and Sheriff's residence until 1960. The 24 jail cells are still intact with original inmate artwork on the walls. Learn the stories of some of the inmates that served time, including William Fee, a man convicted of murdering an unknown woman and was sentenced to hang right in the jail.

Now it's your turn to investigate the cells and see for yourself if the only man hanged in Wayne County is still walking the cell-block. Many paranormal investigators believe he is. Tour the three floors of exhibition space, such as Lyons Pottery & Clyde Glass, the Military Room which spans the War of 1812 to Vietnam War, a Child's 1856 bedroom and much more.
