Day One First stop, Lunch at Silvio's Italian Villa, Warwick, NY Noon The building that houses Silvio's Italian Villa Restaurant in Warwick was built in the late 1700s by Revolutionary War Veteran Levi Ellis. The Vail family who occupied it from 1920 to 1960 has an especially frightful story. The sister of Roy Vail, a gunsmith who lived in the house and ran his business nearby, was found murdered in 1972. Her death seemed without motive and no one was ever formerly charged, but rumors surfaced about Roy's involvement. A decade later, Roy Vail walked into the room where Table 24 now sits and took his own life. The house was later converted to a restaurant where strange occurrences continue to this day — ghostly shapes, unexplained footsteps and sounds, disappearing items, a basement that brings on chills. Is it Roy, his sister, or someone from earlier days? Supposedly the original owners had a scandalous divorce. Is it one of them? Go dine. Wing's Castle is the brainchild of artists Toni Ann Wing and her late husband, Peter. Their unique home has been featured on Extreme Homes on HGTV, Roadside Attractions on TravelChannel.com and American Pickers on the History Channel. A visit and tour there will leave you mesmerized by the antique memorabilia and collectibles; everything from military to primitive trinkets, each with their own story to tell. The owners relate stories of unexplained events in and around the castle house—why Toni took an axe to a goat-headed artifact embedded in the castle wall; why trick-or-treaters never seem to venture past the jack-o-lantern at the driveway entrance... one visit inside and you'll know why.

After your tour, take in the unbelievable views of the Hudson River Valley, framed by their impressive "Stonehenge" style hilltop setting, complete with a dinosaur footprint found on property.

Ghost Hunters investigated Saratoga Springs' Canfield Casino in 2010. The investigation was prompted by reports of unexplained phenomena in the 140 year old landmark building in Congress Park. According to Jamie Parillo, Executive Director of the Saratoga Springs History Museum, while unusual events had taken place sporadically in the building in recent years, they accelerated after the opening of an exhibition of antique clothing once owned and worn by members of some of Saratoga Springs most prominent first families, now all deceased. Featuring three floors of exhibits as well as dynamic programs throughout the year, the Saratoga Springs History Museum welcomes visitors and members to learn more about this famous city and the people that made it so.

9:00 am Arrival at Dr. Best House & Medical Museum

Steeped in a village over 300 years old, the House is a time capsule from the earliest formation of medicine. The property contains medical apparatus' that will turn your blood cold, tales of deaths and misfortune in this small, rural community with original obituaries, photos and death certificates. Paranormal investigations have revealed significant activity with EVPs and recordings of piano playing and distant voices.

Guided historical haunted tour with a photo gallery, eye-witness accounts of unexplained events, and discussion of evidence from previous paranormal investigations on the property. From the death of a beloved young son, the doctor's young wife, and the loss the doctor himself much tragedy befell this family – all within the walls of this house.

1:00 pm National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum

Tour the Ghostly Galleries of the Haunted Hall of Fame. It's a one-hour tour of the National Baseball Hall of Fame that begins with an introduction in the Bullpen Theater, where baseball's relationship to ghosts and horror is explained. Visitors will then take a guided ghost walk through the galleries, including a stop in "Sacred Ground," where the hauntings of Wrigley Field and Tiger Stadium are revealed. There's also a visit to the Ted Williams display and the second floor timeline, where voices and shadow figures have been seen. The tour also includes a stop in the Plaque Gallery, alleged to be haunted by Shoeless Joe Jackson and Ty Cobb.

Day Four

9:00 am Travel to the Herkimer Home State Historic Site

Visit the Georgian-style mansion that was the home to courageous Revolutionary War hero, General Nicholas Herkimer. He completed construction of his mansion about 1764 in the Mohawk Valley frontier. General Herkimer's place in history was assured in 1777. Herkimer was en route to help defend Fort Stanwix when he and his men were ambushed by British-allied Loyalists and Iroquois at Oriskany. Although seriously wounded in the leg, Herkimer kept command during the fierce combat. After the battle, Herkimer was carried home and his leg was amputated 10 days later. Infection had already spread and hours later, when Herkimer died reading from his Bible, he was immediately regarded a martyr to the cause of American freedom, and his home became a shrine. Visitors to Herkimer Home today will marvel at the grandness of this Georgian-style mansion that once stood on the colonial frontier. The unspoiled landscape, including the Herkimer family burial ground, is remarkably unchanged from that of the 18th century. Visit to learn the accounting of unusual sightings and sounds that still occur today. Reports of ghostly voices, footsteps and doors shutting are heard throughout the mansion. A tour guide has reported that a candlestick flew across the room. There is also a strange mist seen in the cemetery.

11:00 am Guided tour of the Rome Capitol Theatre

One of the most interesting and stylish haunts in Central NY is the depression-era Capitol Theatre. Built in 1927, this art-deco theatre seats 2,500 and boasts a Moller Organ in the orchestra pit. Paranormal occurrences date back more than 30 years. Witnesses have reported a shadow figure of a man, organ music (despite the lack of a working organ until 2003), whispered conversations, opening doors, and even the sounds of an ongoing show late at night.

2:30 pm After lunch, visit the Chittenango Landing Canal Boat Museum

The drydocks at Chittenango Landing, built in 1855, are where craftsman constructed and repaired the 96-foot long cargo boats that carried materials along the Erie Canal. The Erie Canal boatmen and workers of the 19th and early 20th centuries had a superstitious nature. Thieves and murderers often lurked along the Erie Canal in the 19th century. It's no wonder many believe the victims' spirits may still roam the towpath in search of justice. Find out about the origins of these superstitions, the language and culture of the canal folk, and some of the most popular ghost stories along the Erie Canal.
