The Starr Clark Tin Shop and Underground Railroad Museum was built in the early 1800s and was home to a tin shop run by tinsmith Starr Clark. Clark was an abolitionist who hosted meetings and gave refuge to slaves. His shop became a well-documented stop on the Underground Railroad, and provided shelter to fleeing slaves through the Civil War.

Today the refurbished museum includes Underground Railroad exhibits and artifacts. Paranormal investigators have found the site to be "interesting" and visitors have reported shadows, voices, and the feeling of being touched.

The Starr Clark Tin Shop and Underground Railroad Museum offers ghost hunts for up to 15 participants, and guided tours for up to 30 participants, available by reservation only. The Museum also offers paranormal group investigations by appointment.
